T 357 Restoration appeal

Following a vote by Members at our Summer 2019 event, our 1931 <u>T 357</u> has been chosen for restoration. Our talented team of volunteers and external specialist restorers will work together on this project. We are hoping to fund this ambitious £350k restoration with an equal combination of donations and grant funding.

We also hope to re-create a replica gas trailer for the bus. This originally burned anthracite to produce gas during the wartime petrol shortage.

Why is this project unique? T 357 is the only survivor of a class of just 12 built. It has been described as the bus rescue of the century, having been recovered from France where it had been in covered storage since 1958. When the bus was threatened with being scrapped, we purchased it and brought it back to the UK. It appeared in its unrestored state at the Trust's Open Day at its old site in Redhill Road in April 2003. It has been in covered storage ever since.

Our aim is to restore this vehicle to full running and passenger carrying status. Appropriately, it has local connections, the body having been built in the Weymann factory at Addlestone.

Q&A with Mark Rowell, Volunteer Steward

When did your interest in buses begin?

I was a bus spotter when I was 10 years old. When I retired around 2019, I was looking for some sort of interesting activity. The Bus Museum seemed the logical thing to do.

What's your favourite bus?

A difficult one! RML 2440 – a Garston bus. I rode on it many times on route 306 to Elstree when I was in the ATC (age 15-16 years).

How did you get involved with Acton Works LTE?

I began my apprenticeship in 1972 at Acton Works, learning electrical fitting. In my second year we were allowed work experience at the depots: first Ealing Common, working on CO and R stock carriages, later Neasden depot. I received the honour of going to Ruislip Central Line depot, working on 1960s stock. Unfortunately, I was electrocuted and spent my Christmas in Mount Vernon Hospital burns unit! I eventually passed my apprenticeship four years later and became an electrician at Baker Street lighting department - but I knew nothing!

Now I am retired but I do know a little bit more... luckily! It is a wonder that I got a position as an apprentice because a friend and I had been chewing Juicy Fruit gum prior to a medical, and we both failed!

What would you take to a desert island?

My AVRO Lancaster Dambuster model kit. It is 1:32 scale with hundreds of parts, which would definitely help to pass the time until I was rescued!

What's your motto or words to live by?

"Do unto others before they do you." (A joke but apt!)

Fun fact?

I have a bus stop in my front garden! The concrete post was discovered abandoned under a hedge nearby. I asked the householder if he wanted it and the reply was, "It's yours if you take it away." So I did! I bought the flag from the LBM TransportFest market, scratch built the shelter and added the timetables later.

Only once or twice has it been mistaken for a real bus stop - including by Amazon!




